APPROVAL OF AGENDA:

The agenda for the meeting was reviewed and circulated. It was moved by Councillor Little and seconded by Councillor Robinson that:

OLD BUSINESS

Afterschool program – Jody informed council that the afterschool program registration has been published, and we are at full capacity.

NEW BUSINESS:

2025 Budget – Mayor Stannix gave council an update on where the Village stands financially. Despite a few unexpected infrastructure repairs over the summer, the village is still within our budget.

REPORTS:

CAO Report – A citizen has contacted the Village Office expressing concern of the traffic pattern and signage near the Klondike-Beech Street-Rockland Drive, intersection. Council agreed to look into signage to see how it can be better communicated. Furthermore, contact will be made to Department of Transportation to see if they have any recommendation or best practices.

Councillor Little - A citizen has expressed concern regarding the narrow corner on the east end of Oak Street, near the skating rink, and requested council consider making Oak Street one way. Council will take the suggestion under advisement and will see what solutions are available.

Councillor Robinson – Job interviews have closed for the afterschool program. Interviews will take place later in the week.

Councillor Swim – Nothing to report

Councillor Gallant – A citizen has reached out concerning high speed traffic going around the corner on Spruce Street, and the amount of children that live in the area. Council agreed to reach out to the Department of Transportation to see if they have any recommendation or best practices.
